Consultation on Proposal for Riverside Bridge School to extend its age range upwards by three years, from the current 4-16 to a proposed new range of 4-19, in order to provide additional post-16 special school places in Barking and Dagenham.

1.0 Introduction

As a result of the continuing increased need for post-16 special school places in the local authority, the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham has made a request to Partnership Learning (the academy trust that oversees the school) for Riverside Bridge School to extend its age range. It is proposed to extend Riverside Bridge School's age range upwards by three years, from the current 4-16 to a proposed new range of 4-19, starting in September 2023.

This document sets out the opportunities for interested parties to give their views on the proposals outlined in more detail below.

2.0 Riverside Bridge School

Riverside Bridge School is a day special school in Barking and Dagenham which opened in 2015, serving the special educational needs of young people currently ranging from 4 years of age to 16 years of age, with a maximum legal capacity of 270 pupils.

The school is based on two sites – the original Riverside Campus site on the Barking Riverside development (which is also home to Riverside Primary School and Riverside Secondary School) and the Thames Road (City Farm) site which opened in September 2022.

The school is part of the Partnership Learning multi-academy trust, which oversees thirteen schools in Barking and Dagenham, neighbouring boroughs and Southend-on-Sea.

3.0 Background

All the current state-funded special school provisions for post-16 pupils in Barking and Dagenham are full for pupils with ASD - Autistic Spectrum Disorder, MLD - Moderate Learning Difficulty, SLD - Severe Learning Difficulty and PMLD - Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulty.

However, the Local Authority has identified a continuing rise in demand for post-16 places in special schools and is therefore requesting the proposed age range extension at Riverside Bridge School.

5.2 Actions following on from the Consultation

Partnership Learning will read and consider all responses received.

The summary will be submitted to the Department for Education in order to inform their decision on whether to approve the proposed age range extension.
